What happens when you can't seem to reach that hostess or lead for the "call back" you promised? How
many times should you call back? Do you feel after a couple of calls that she doesn't want to talk with you
and is avoiding you? This is not a comfortable feeling, but look at the following script! I believe it will be
very helpful to relieve that feeling on "both sides". If it is done sincerely, you are communicating your
concerns for the other person. Life does happen and we should always believe the best about all people!!!
Even if she just didn't call back, she will know you care after listening to this message. The important point
here is to be sincere. This is not a script to trick someone into calling you back. It is an example of how to
show your concern to others. I suggest you keep this in your "scripts" file for future use.
I will usually try 5-6 times to contact someone. If they don't respond, I leave a message something like this:
Hi, (her name), this is (your name) againI'm calling because I'm beginning to worry
about you. I'm nervous that something bad may have happened to you. I've left several messages and I've
even dropped a note by your house. It's so unlike you to not return my calls – are you ok? I'm also worried
that you may not be returning my calls because of this class we have booked. Please don't worry about
thatI'm not! I just want to know that you are okay.
Please call me,(her name).Bye.
Be aware that sometimes things DO HAPPEN to people. Always give them the benefit of the doubt. This
script is almost 100% successful. I don't ever remember a time when I didn't get a call back. Besides
thatit just reinforces that you DO CARE ABOUT THEM.
Also remember that NSD Debbie Moore rescheduled her appointment with her "pleasantly persistent"
consultant 8 times before she actually held it. The only reason she went was because her husband told her
to go so "that woman" would quit calling their home! Well, Debbie signed her Beauty Consultant
Agreement and went on to become an NSD! Are you willing to give up on someone who could be your
future NSD? I don't think so!
